

WCF Awards Scholarships to Utahns Who Have Lost Loved Ones in Industrial Accidents

WHO:

On February 2, 2004 M'Lissa Griffith suddenly found herself the single mother of four young children. Her husband died in an industrial accident while working for the Provo River Water Users Association. Ever since that day six years ago, M'Lissa has been an example of courage to her children and those around her. At the age of 42 she decided to go back to school at UVU to study nursing. Besides being a student and full-time mom and dad to her children, she is on the PTA board, and a member of the Foreign Affair Club at UVU.

M'Lissa, her daughter, Brittney, a recent high school graduate, and 44 other exemplary Utahns who have lost loved ones in work-related accidents, will be presented educational scholarships at the upcoming Workers Compensation Fund Legacy of Learning Scholarship event.

The Legacy of Learning is a Scholarship Program offered by the Workers Compensation Fund (WCF) to the spouses and children of workers killed in industrial accidents insured by the company. This event, a luncheon and awards ceremony, is a meaningful tribute to those who have passed on.
